

 <p>Class: Elm</p> <p>Term 3, 2025 – 2026</p>	<p>English: <u>Reading</u> – Guided group reading <u>Writing</u> – Stone Age Boy The children will complete a variety of writing pieces focusing on using present and past tenses correctly and consistently. They will also group related ideas into paragraphs and use inverted commas to punctuate direct speech. <u>Handwriting</u> – letter and word practice using spelling focus. <u>Spellings</u> -digraph ‘ai’ and tetragraph ‘aigh’; digraph ‘ei’ and tetragraph ‘eigh’; digraph ‘ey’ makes an ‘ai’ sound; suffix ‘-ly’; homophones; challenge words</p>	<p>Maths: Number Multiplication and division - Equal groups - Using arrays - Multiples of 2, 5 and 10 - Multiply and divide by 3, 4 and 8 - Multiply and divide a 2 digit number by a 1 digit number</p>
<p>Science: Forces and magnets This project teaches children about forces and what they do. They will learn about pushing and pulling forces and sort different actions into pushes and pulls. They will identify and explain contact forces and will learn about and investigate frictional forces. They will use force meters to measure the forces needed to carry out everyday tasks and record their measurements.</p>	<p>Geography: Rocks, Relics and Rumbles This project teaches children about the different layers of the Earth, including plate tectonics and their potential effects on the Earth's surface. They will investigate different types of rock to learn about their uses and properties and investigate soil and fossils, including learning about the work of Mary Anning. They will also learn about volcanoes and the long and short-term consequences that these can have.</p>	<p>RE: World Faith of Sikhism This term the children will be learning to describe things that are important to Sikhs and explain how these beliefs influence their lives and actions. They will make suggestions about what Sikhs believe about God and explain what the 5 K's are, including why they hold special importance for Khalsa Sikhs. They will also make clear links between the teachings of the Guru Granth Sahib and the practice of seva, and describe some of the ways Sikhs demonstrate equality through their actions in the Langar.</p>
<p>PSHE – Dreams and Goals This project will teach the children about people who have faced difficult challenges and achieved success. Children will be able to identify a dream/ambition that is important to them. They will learn to face new challenges and work out the best ways for them to achieve them. They will recognise obstacles which might hinder achievement and take steps to overcome them.</p>	<p>Computing – Creating Media This project will teach children that there are different types of camera shots that can make photos or videos look more effective. They will learn to edit photos and videos using film editing software. They will also learn to add transitions and text to videos.</p>	<p>MFL: French The children will learn about animal nouns, both singular and plural. They will listen to stories and tell each other about their favourite animals.</p>
<p>Art: Ammonites This project helps children explore the artistic techniques used in both sketching and printmaking, guiding them through skills such as shading, line work, texture creation, and the basics of transferring images to different surfaces. It encourages hands-on practice, creativity, and an understanding of how artists develop and refine their visual ideas.</p>	<p>PE - Swimming The children will continue to develop their skills in water safety including pool side rules and different ways of entering the water safely. They will also develop a range of stroke techniques to be able to confidently swim distances appropriate for their ability.</p>	<p>PE - Games - Handball The unit of work will explore how to apply the principles of attack vs defence, with a particular focus on passing and moving. Pupils will learn how to keep possession and eventually score in order to win a modified game.</p>
