Science: Animal Survival (continuing)

This project teaches children about growth in animals by exploring the life cycles of some familiar animals. They build on learning about the survival of humans by identifying the basic needs of animals for survival, including food, water, air and shelter.

History: Magnificent Monarchs (continuing)

This project teaches children about the English and British monarchy from AD 871 to the present day. Using timelines, information about royal palaces, portraits and other historical sources, they build up an understanding of the monarchs and then research six of the most significant sovereigns.

RE: Islam (continuing)

This investigation enables pupils to learn in depth from Islam, finding out about Muslim ways of life and beliefs, so that pupils can develop thoughtful ideas and viewpoints of their own about some religious and spiritual questions.

PSHE: Changing Me

Change is taught as a natural and normal part of growing up and the range of emotions that can occur with change are explored and discussed., Children look at different life cycles in nature and reflect on the changes that occur (not including puberty) The will learn the correct words for private parts of the body and about inappropriate touch and assertiveness.

Art: Portraits and Poses.

The children will analyse the portraits of Tudor monarchs and compare Tudor portraits and selfies today. They will have the opportunity to see and draw real Tudor portraits at Hever Castle!
They will learn how to place the features on a face and make observational drawings of facial features e.g. eyes. focussing on shape, line and shading. They will build skills for a final artwork using mixed media.

Music-using instruments to tell a story

This unit helps the children learn how events, actions and feelings within stories can be represented by pitch, dynamics and tempo.
The children will be using a variety of percussion instruments to explore the theme.

PE: Rackets and Balls

The focus of the learning is for pupils to refine their understanding of how they can use their hitting (striking) skills to send the ball into space in order to win a game. Pupils will refine this understanding of why in certain games, hitting into space is essential in order to score points against the opposing team.

PE: Dodging

The unit of work will challenge pupils to apply their knowledge of how, where and why to dodge. Pupils will learn the roles of attacking and defending and start to understand when we attack and when we defend while using their dodging skills.
