



Class: Oak
Term 6, 2025 – 2026

English:
Reading – vocabulary, fluency and comprehension skills activities based on a range of texts.
Writing – this term, the children’s work will be based on ‘The Selfish Giant’ by Emma Oscar Wild. During the unit, the children will use Y6 grammar and punctuation to write a range of texts including: descriptive writing, letters, diary entries and narrative.
Spellings: spellings will be set following assessment. They will be tailored to the children each week.

Maths:
Project – White Rose Bakery
This term maths will be project based. The children will cover the following topics:

- ratio and proportion – scaling of recipes
- cost – strategies for calculation
- profit and loss – strategies for calculation
- packaging – 3D shapes nets
- baking - measurement

History: Britain at War *(continued)*
This project teaches children about the causes, events and consequences of the First and Second World Wars, the influence of new inventions on warfare, how life in Great Britain was affected and the legacy of the wars in the post-war period.
Oak class will be visiting Knole House with a focus on WWII.

Science: Evolution and Inheritance
This project teaches children how living things on Earth have changed over time and how fossils provide evidence for this. They learn how characteristics are passed from parents to their offspring and how variation in offspring can affect their survival, with changes (adaptations) possibly leading to the evolution of a species

French - Café culture
In this unit of work, the children will:

- revise and learn nouns for French café food.
- express opinions about food and drinks.
- create a café menu.
- politely order food and drinks.
- understand a café conversation.
- create a café conversation.

Universal – what can be done to reduce racism?
This project enables pupils to learn in depth from different religious and spiritual ways of life through exploring ideas and examples of what religions do to reduce racism, including for example the work of different religious leaders in promoting respect and the teaching of different sacred texts about human unity.

PSHE: Relationships
In this project, the class explores mental health and ways to support their well-being. They discuss the stages and causes of grief and loss, recognise controlling behaviours, and learn about online safety, including how to communicate positively and safely with others.
PSHE: Changing Me
In this project, Oak class will explore self-image, self-esteem, puberty, relationships, and how babies develop from conception to birth. They will also discuss their feelings about moving to secondary school.

Music: Musical theatre
Music will be taught through the Year 6 end of year production. The key knowledge includes the following:

- musical theatre includes both character and action songs, which explain what is going on and how characters feel.
- choreography means the organisation of steps or moves in a dance.

musical theatre uses transitions, which are short passages of music used to move between sections of the musical action.

DT: Make do and mend
This project teaches children a range of simple sewing stitches, including ways of recycling and repurposing old clothes and materials.

Computing: AI
During this project the children will explore what AI is and learn the basics of AI, including how AI responds to texts prompts and how AI can be used to generate images. To finish the project, they will debate the ethical issues surrounding AI, including data privacy, bias and responsible use.

PE Outdoor: Cricket - Pupils will consolidate their knowledge, understanding and ability to effectively apply a range of fielding skills, batting skills and tactics into mini games.
Forest school - Forest school provide opportunities for pupils to develop self-awareness, self- confidence, form positive relationships and develop strategies in order to take risks within the boundaries of safety. The children will learn about the forest school environment and practice new skills using tools and woodland materials.
